Adoption of Agenda
The agenda was adopted without changes.

Review of Minutes

The minutes were accepted with one minor change.

Opening Remarks

Paul Hoeffel gave an update on his meeting with the Art Center College of Design in California. He met with students and staff to discuss the Planning Committee's thinking regarding the themes of the Conference in order to help them create an appropriate Conference design. The students have familiarized themselves with the issues of the Millennium Declaration, the MDGs and UN reform. With the guidance of faculty members, students will submit their designs by April and from these, a final design will be chosen. He said that it would be best if the Conference title will be decided by the Planning Committee in the next week.

Discussion of Proposed Themes

The challenge is to create a linkage of themes between "global security",

"MDGs", and "UN reform". The term "renewal" is part of Conference theme, along with other points mentioned. Also discussed, was the option to leave out the phrase "Millennium +5" on the basis that audiences may not understand the term. "Bridging the Gap" remained a favored phrase, specifically in regards to the "partnership" sought by NGOs and governments. In response, some pointed out that the phrase "partnership" may suggest that NGO and governments are on an equal playing ground, which could be viewed as misleading. Catch phrases, which could be turned against the Organization, need to be avoided although some would venture that any media attention achieved could actually be beneficial. Above all the title be bold, strong and dynamic, while remaining realistic and should constructive.
