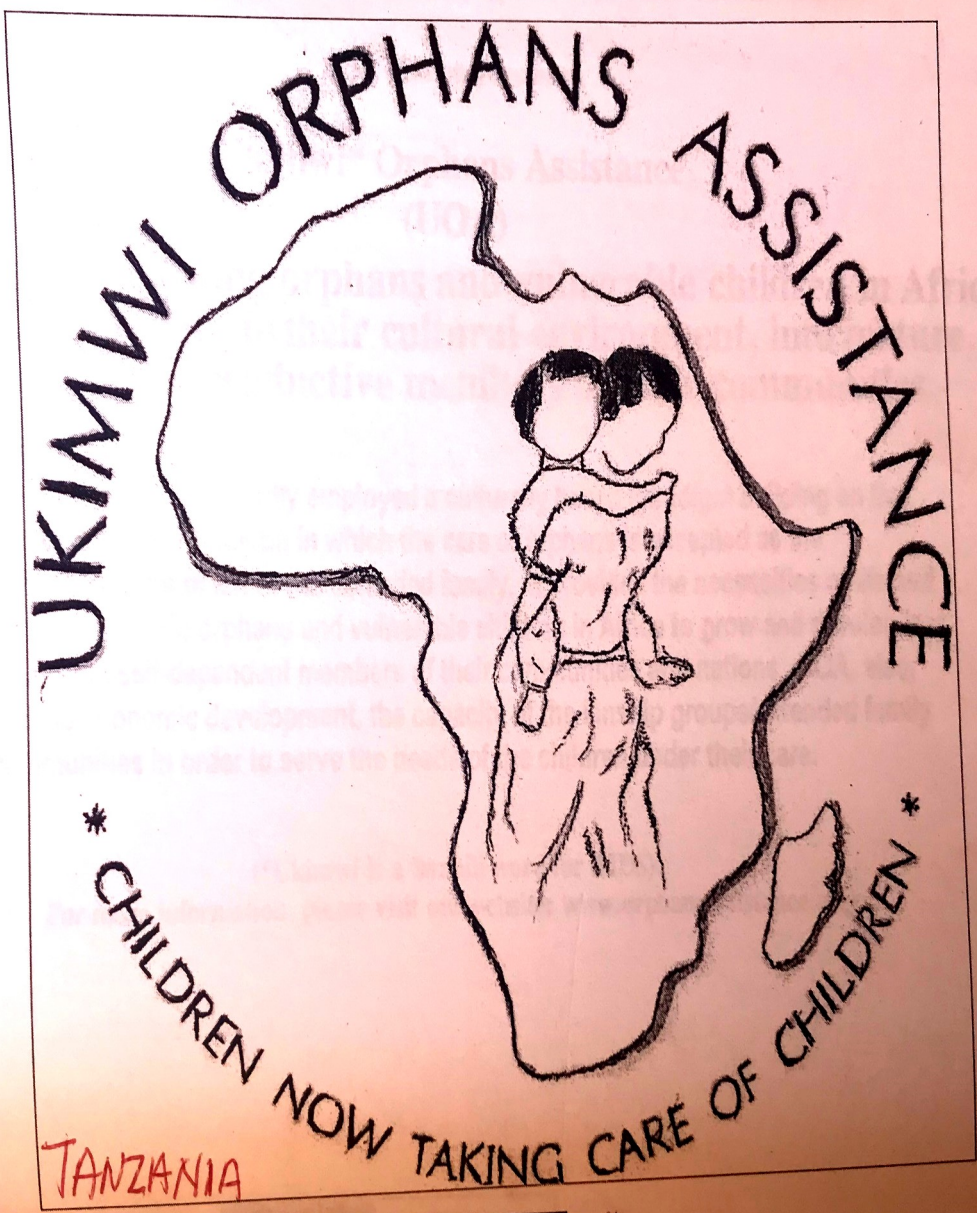




Having been advised by Dr. John Rutayuga that we should contact you directly and submit the names of children who are in dire need of sponsorship as they have no parents to support them in secondary school, I beg to present the details of ten such children hereunder.

Please note that where the line items "clothing" "bedding" and "eating utensils" appear, they are made up of the sub-items in the breakdowns given below:



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
