Learn About African Action on AIDS (AAA)

AAA is a tax exempt non-profit organization registered in the USA and operating under section 501(c) 3 of the IRS code. It is also registered in Cameroon (auth. No00174/A/MINAT/DAP/SDLP/SAC). It has special consultative status with the United Nations ECOSOC and the UN Department of Information.

AAA's work is based on 3 programmes:

"JUST KNOW" Campaign emphasizes:

- · Knowledge of one's body
- Knowledge that leads to behavior change
- Knowledge that helps to visualize a future without AIDS

"Health before Wealth" Concept promotes:

- Testing for HIV
- Clean hands (hand washing stations)
- Clean water (drinking stations)
- · Dignified toilets
- Fighting against Malaria (treated mosquito bed nets)
- Vaccination
- Anti worms medicin

"Women's economic autonomy" through our

Scholarship Programme. This scholarship enables each teenage orphan girl to complete at least a secondary, general or technical education that will lead to financial and economic autonomy, greatly reducing the risk of being infected with HIV through sexual abuse and violence.

The Ebola Tragedy in 2014 has brought back the focus on the kind of health systems needed to protect African people from perpetual death and sadness. In this context, and as developed in AAA e – News Brief in November 2012, http://www.facebook.com/africanactiononaids Prevention of diseases is key, rather than retrospective treatment after the disease onset. But TALKING about PREVENTION isn't good

enough. We now need to DO IT and MASTER THE PREVENTION PRACTICE.

Mastering the diseases prevention practice is not as simple as registering the number of hours invested and visible. It is about how consistent you are in fulfilling your own wish. It is commitment to self care/self interest. It is your profound intention to showing up to what you decided to do to yourself. In this case, it should lead to 3 commitments:

MASTERING AS COMMITMENT by governments to eliminate common diseases caused by lack or dirty water to drink and clean hands, lack of dignified toilets, lack of environmental hygiene, investment on mass health education mostly in local languages. Because we now know that these precautions will eliminate major killers like: Ebola, Cholera, Malaria, Diarrhea, etc... MASTERING AS COMMITMENT by each individual African, to understand that only if they themselves are committed to keeping their hands, toilets, water clean and voluntarily contributing in keeping their environment and community clean will they be accorded respect of Human Dignity by others. In so doing, they will reduce community vulnerability that aggravates the vulnerability of each African!
