
## AFRICAN ACTION ON AIDS, INC. (AAA) PROFILE:

ORIGIN: IN 1990, AAA WAS CREATED BY A GROUP OF FORWARD THINKING AFRICAN WOMEN, SEVERAL OF WHOM WORKED AT THE UNITED NATIONS. IT WAS CREATED OUT OF A SPIRIT OF SOLIDARITY WITH THE LARGE NUMBER OF ORPHANS REMAINING AS A RESULT OF THE DISEASE, AND THE STRONG BELIEF THAT "NO ONE IS ALONE." THE AIM IS TO PROVIDE FINANCIAL AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO AND EFFECT CHANGE THROUGH LOCAL ORGANIZATIONS PROVIDING SUPPORT TO ORPHANS OF AIDS.

STRATEGY: AAA IS COMMITTED TO PROVIDING SUPPORT FOR CHILDREN WHO LOST THEIR PARENTS TO HIV/AIDS. AT THE SAME TIME, AAA BELIEVES STRONGLY THAT SOLUTIONS TO COMMUNITY PROBLEMS MUST BE GENERATED FROM AND HAVE THE COMMITMENT OF MEMBERS OF THE LOCAL COMMUNITY. HENCE, AAA DOES NOT CREATE NEW INSTITUTIONS OR PROGRAMS, BUT PARTNERS WITH EXISTING COMMUNITY BASED INITIATIVES, WHERE THE CAPACITY AND THE WILL TO COST EFFECTIVELY IMPLEMENT PROJECTS ARE DEMONSTRATED BY A VISIBLE RECORD OF ACHIEVEMENT.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS: Over 500 orphans have successfully completed 6 years of schooling under the sponsorship of AAA. The first five AAA sponsored students recently graduated from the Makerere University, Uganda. Twenty-seven youth resource centers have been established in Benin, Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Cote d'Ivoire, Ethiopia, Gabon, Ghana, Guinea, Liberia, Malawi, Mali, Niger, Sierra-Leone, Senegal, South Africa, Tanzania, Zimbabwe. The focal point of the centers is a library. Activities include skills training conducted by community leaders and academic tutoring programs. We call these sites the "Centers of Excellence." AAA provides funding for sites which supply daily hot meals and shelter for orphans, and for workshops that disseminate information on sexual and reproductive health information and hiv/aids prevention education.

AAA'S FIVE YEAR PLAN: THE LONG RANGE PLANS OF AAA INCLUDE BUILDING AT LEAST ONE CENTER OF EXCELLENCE IN ALL COUNTRIES IN SUB-SAHARA AFRICA AND SPONSORING A MINIMUM OF 10,000 ORPHANS BY THE YEAR 2005.


